Attended funeral (funeral director's charges only)	
This is a funeral where family and friends have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person at the same time as they attend their burial or cremation.	
Taking care of all necessary legal and administrative arrangements	To be confirmed
Collecting and transporting the deceased person from the place of death within 15 miles of the funeral director's premises	To be confirmed
Care of the deceased person before the funeral in appropriate facilities. The deceased person will be kept at the funeral director's branch premises	To be confirmed

Viewing of the deceased person for family and friends, by appointment with the funeral director, where viewing is requested by the customer	To be confirmed

This is a funeral where family and friends may choose to have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person, but they do not attend the burial or cremation itself.
